

Dear Monsignors, Reverend Fathers, Deacons, Seminarians, Women and Men Religious, Beloved Sisters and Brothers,

On June 2, 1943, Pope Pius XII appointed Bishop James A. McFadden as the first bishop of the newly established Diocese of Youngstown. In 1951, the same year he died, Bishop McFadden published a book titled, *The March of the Eucharist*. In the dedication of this book, Bishop McFadden wrote, "The establishment of a new diocese under the exigencies of a great global war that caused priorities on building materials and restrictions of available labor; and, in addition, a shortage of priests and sisters, many of whom went to the front and offered their services to God and Country, might have been an extremely difficult task, but in reality, it was an undertaking of love. Love begets love and the arduous burdens that had to be confronted were greatly lightened through the generosity, loyal and sincere co-operation of the members of the new diocese."

As we celebrate 80 years of this local Church, we behold the countless acts of love, generosity and collaboration that have made our Church what it is today. Together, we gather in the Mother Church of our diocese to give thanks for all who have been part of this amazing story. And we pray for God's continued blessings on this vine which extends over the counties of Ashtabula, Columbiana, Mahoning, Portage, Stark and Trumbull. With the psalmist we pray, "Turn back again, God of hosts; look down from heaven and see; visit this vine, the stock your right hand has planted, and the son whom you made strong for yourself." (Psalm 80:15-16)

Congratulations! Together, like our ancestors of old, let us continue our march with the Eucharist and let us pray, "That All May Be One."
